



The 4-Berth Campervan.

This is your complete guide to our 4-Berth Campervan. Any questions you have may be in this booklet however, if not, please feel free to call our helpline and speak to one of our staff members.

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GENERAL OVERVIEW

DISCOVER THE ULTIMATE GETAWAY VEHICLE BASED ON A 'WALK-THROUGH' NEW GENERATION AUTOMATIC DIESEL TOYOTA HI-ACE. SUPER EASY TO DRIVE AND PARK AND FEATURING A WELL-EQUIPPED KITCHEN WITH AN INDUCTION COOKTOP, COZY DINETTE AREA WITH TWO BED OPTIONS. IT HAS A DUCTED DIESEL HEATING SYSTEM TO KEEP YOU WARM WHEN OFF GRID. THIS CAMPERVAN IS YOUR TICKET TO AN IMMEDIATE HOLIDAY ADVENTURE. PERFECTLY DESIGNED FOR 2 ADULTS AND 2 CHILDREN.

THINGS TO NOTE:

Check the vehicle condition report before leaving the depot.

Be familiar with advisory stickers on windscreen:

- Note unsealed road travelling warnings.
- When driving, keep to the left hand side of the road.
- Be aware of your vehicle's clearance height (2.8 metres).
- Take extra care when parking or turning off the main road.
- Do not park in multi-storey car parks; be careful of awnings, low verandahs, petrol station canopies, drive-thru's and tree branches. Do not 'cut' corners too sharply (the top of vehicle leans in as you turn, risking damage).
- Tasmania has many nocturnal animals (active at dusk, during the night and dawn). When travelling at night, we recommend travelling at much slower speeds. Wombats and other wildlife can cause a lot of damage (and road-kill is sad).
- During windy conditions we recommend you reduce your speed on all roads as taller vehicles are susceptible to side winds.
- Smoking and pets are not permitted in our vehicles.
- On return of your vehicle, please ensure the interior is in a clean and tidy state, with all used linen placed in a plastic bag and the dishes, pans etc are washed.
- Familiarise yourself with the vehicle controls and adjust mirrors before setting off.

INSTRUCTIONS

- Use the remote on the key to lock/unlock all doors on the campervan.
- The fuel door release is located to the lower right side of the steering wheel. Pull to open the fuel door which is located on the passenger side of the campervan. This vehicle takes **DIESEL**.
- The vehicle height is 2.8 metres.

THE ELECTRICS:

This vehicle has a 200-amp lithium home battery and 2000 W inverter charging system. The home battery is charged by three methods: a/ from the rooftop 160w solar panel when parked. b/ when driving from the vehicle alternator. c/ when the 240v lead is plugged in to a powered campsite.

When you're not connected to mains power, you're only using the lithium home battery. If you want to use the power points or cooktop when either plugged in or off grid, turn on the inverter/charger switch. That gives you mains power so you can use the cooktop or the power points off grid. Use any appliance plugged in to a power point sparingly to preserve your battery power level. Keep a watch on the power level percentage on the Victron display. The minimum battery level is 20%. Recharge approximately every 3rd night on a powered site to ensure level above 20%.

When connected to a powered site with the orange power lead for charging the home battery and to have unlimited use of power point items, ensure that the inverter/charger switch is turned on.

When you're not using it, turn the inverter/charger switch off.

The power system is protected by the circuit breaker located underneath the rear seat and should be in the up position.

THE SWITCH PANEL:

The switch panel is located below the sink;

- **P** is for pump, this is the water pump to use the sink tap.
- **L** is for lights. Turning this on will turn on all lights however every light can also be independently switched on and off.
- **A** is for accessories. That's the charge points. The van has USB's and 12-volt outlets. If you turn the A switch off, all accessories go off.
- **F** is for fridge. Flick the switch up to turn on, the switch will illuminate. There is a thermostat dial inside the fridge so you can regulate your temperature.

The 12-volt socket is available for use with the inverter/charger and 'A' for accessories switched on.

DIESEL HOME HEATING:

The Webasto switch/dial is for your ducted diesel-powered home heating system. When stationary, turn the dial to the '2 o'clock' position and heating will flow through the vents below the seat after a few minutes.

Ensure the vents are clear of obstructions.

The heater will use fuel from the vehicle diesel tank at the frugal rate of 1 litre per 10 hours run time.

INDUCTION COOKTOP:

The induction cooktop can be used either connected to a powered site, or off-grid.

Turn the inverter/charger and cooktop switches on.

Turn on the power switch on the cooktop surface, select your hotplate and use the +/- to adjust heat.

After cooking, lower the plate lid.

Please do not use the plate lid as a chopping board! There is a chopping board stored in your kitchen cupboard.

SETTING UP THE BED:

In this vehicle we have a double travel seat in the back with seatbelts and child restraint points. First, remove the head rests. Release the latches located down the side of the seat on both sides. Grab the front of the seat base with your left hand, and lift it upwards. While the base is in the upwards position, use your right hand to bring the bottom of the base forwards, and your bed will drop in to a flat position. The extra mattress in the rear storage can also be placed on top of the low bed for extra cushioning if desired.

SETTING THE BED BACK INTO THE SEAT POSITION:

To bring the bed back into travel seat position again, lift the seat base up until it clicks and then rotate and push the seat towards the back of the vehicle. It's important it goes towards the back of the vehicle so that this can align and latch. Place the headrests back on top of the seats.

OVERHEAD BED: (100kg weight limit).

Untether the bed base boards and restraint strap and slide them in position in the nosecone. Use the mattresses from the rear. Gain access from the lower bed.

BLOCK OUT CURTAINS:

This van has full block out curtains all the way around. There's a clip-on type curtain provided that clips on around the front windscreen.

SETTING UP THE TABLE:

The table is stored behind the driver's seat. Place the leg into the hole in front of the back seat and place the table top on the pole.

SWIVEL PASSENGER SEAT:

Slide the seat forward then grab the release handle located to the side. Release that and rotate the seat around. To put it back, pull it forward and rotate it around until it clips in, adjust the seat back and forth to where's comfortable when seating.

Do not open the passenger front door if the awning arm is attached to the door. Use rear side door for entry/exit.

SETTING UP THE AWNING:

The awning is a sun shade for calm days only. Don't leave it extended at night or when not with the van. You are responsible for damage to the awning, so please use with extreme care.

It's really important that you make sure the sliding and passenger doors are closed first. Grab the awning handle that's stored at the back of the vehicle. Place the awning handle into the awning and wind the awning out about a metre, the awning should support itself. Grab the awning leg out, rotate it down and match the height with the other one. Wind the awning out some more and with that keep moving the legs. Wind the awning out to the desired length, you can then set the height. Once you're happy with the extended position of the awning, put the foot into the locking tap on the side of the vehicle to lock it down and then reset your height. Grab the centre brace, which is located inside the vehicle near the top bed. The centre brace goes into the awning to add extra support. Click it in and tighten it. We suggest you put that in every time you set the awning up, it adds a lot more strength to the awning.

PACKING AWAY THE AWNING:

First grab the centre brace. Remove that as you installed it. Then remove the awning leg from the vehicle mount. Lift the tab up and set the height to match the other leg. Wind the awning back in and take the awning to about the metre mark in the same position where you set it up. Raise the awning legs, tighten the wing nuts and fold the foot away so it's flat, insert the awning leg into the awning. Doing the same on the other side. Then wind the awning all the way back. Place the handle back in the rear storage.

EXTERNAL VEHICLE CONNECTIONS:

The water fill cap: Located on the drivers side, above the rear wheel. This is where you will fill the water tank. Start with your water pressure on slow and increase the flow as it starts filling up. Once it starts squirting out, you know that's full. On your set of keys there's a key to lock the cap.

The 240-volt mains input: Next to the water fill cap. This is where you connect the vehicle to mains power if you're at a caravan park.

Butane storage box: On the passenger side, you'll find the butane storage box. That's the safe and legal location to store our butane cans (If hired as an option). On the set of keys you'll notice you've got a large washer, that is used to open up this box.
